
Here's a scan of one of several documents sent to me by Harry Hollis in North Carolina. Read his comments about these documents in my MailBag, page 10



THE HAWKROOST:

IN ORDER TO CLARIFY THE CONFUSION AND SCUTTLEBUT COING THE ROUNDS, THE MICHIHAMKER CIVES YOU THE PRESENT STATUS OF THE SQUADRON IN REGARDS TO AWARDS, CALPAIGN RIBBONS, AND EATLE STARS THAT WE ARE ALIGIBLE TO MEAR.

EXCEPTIONS ARE THOSE FEW LEN WHO HAVE BEEN SPECIFICALLY DECOMATED. NO SUTHORITY FOR STAR FOR THIS ORINGAN CALPSIGN HAS YET BEEN RELESSED. ED, THOUGH OME WILL BE ISSUED AT SCHE MEAR FUTURE DATE. Here is the "Real Deal" – the Farewell Greeting from Col Maas that I have had reproduced on the E.F. Buddy Howard tribute page since 2001. Harry Hollis sent me a scan of the actual letter:

> ATR BASE COMMAND AVIASE AIRFIELD NAVAL AIR BASES 93256

To: All CBMU #624 Personnel.

To the officers and men of the finest Maintenance Unit in the Wavy, I wish both to say good-bye and to express the pleasure and privilege it has been for me to know you, work with you and to live among you.

Never have I personally been treated better anywhere under any circumstances than I have been by everyone in 624 on Okinawa.

You have all measured up to the finest traditions of the American Navy, and in deed you have created some new traditions, of which the Navy will always be proud. The Sea Bees and Maintenance Units have contributed largely to our remarkable victorious march to total victory in the Pacific. It is eafe to say that you, and the men and officers in your corps, have by their loyal, faithful, enthusiactic hard work, amazing ingenuity and unparalleled team work, not only took a major part in our ultimate victory but actually shortened this war by many many months, thereby saving untold thousands of American lives.

You in 624 were privileged to be in on the final battle that ended for once and all the hellish dreams of world conquest by the Jap Empire. In fact, you fought in the final battle that ended the Jap Empire. Okinawa will go down in military history as one of the great and most decisive battles in all history.

You played a vital part in that great historic battle. In all the military annals there has never been anything like the organization and work of the Sea Bees.

Your courageous, tireless and magnificent work will be remembered as long as there is American history.

Your work, from the beginning on this island, made it possible for the Marine planes to fly in the vital defense of Okinawa. You were as much a part of that heroic air defense as if you flew the planes yourselfs.

I am proud to have had you in my command, and consider it a high privilege to have been associated with you.

It is a high honor to call each and everyone of you - "Shipmate".

I leave you now for other work to which I have been called, but I will always consider myself part of 624. I am hereby assuming a new title.

Good-bye, good luck, and hopes that you will all be home soon.

GENERAL MAC ARTHUR'S HELDOUGREENS: INSTRUCTIONS FOR THE INITIAL LANDINGS OF ALLIED OCCUPATIONAL FORCES ON JAPAN HAS EKEN MADE FUBLIC FROM GENERAL MAC ARTHUR'S HEADQUARTERS IN MANIL PHEST LANDINGS, ACCORDING TO TOKYO, IS TO BE LADE BY AIRBORNE TROOPS AT AIRFIELDS NEAR TOKYO SUNDAY AND GENERAL LAC AIRFIELDS AT HE WILL LAND AT ASUCHLAIRDRORE TUESDAY. AT THE SAME THEIR, THOUSANDS OF LAIRBORNE AND MANY PERSONEL WILL GO ASHORE AT YOROSUKA MAVAL BASE. SPOKESUEN FROM LAC ARTHUR'S HEADQUAITERS SAID THE LANDINGS WILL BE CARRILD OUT WITH FULL COMBAT GEAR, SIMILATING WAR CONDITIONS. THERE IN A LATER OF LANDINGS WILL BE CARRILD OUT WITH FULL COMBAT GEAR, SIMILATING WAR CONDITIONS. TIONS. THREE DAYS LATER, ON AUGUST 31, THE SUPPLIES ALLIED COLLANDER WILL SIGN THE FOR AL SURRENDER TERES WITH TOP JAPANESE OFFICIALS SCHEMEDE NEAR TOKYO. CESERVERS SAY THE SIGNING WILL TAKE PLACE ABOARD A U.S. BATTLESHIP IN TORYO HARBOR BUT THIS WAS NOT OFFICIALLY ANNOUNCED.

THE JAPANESE ARE INSTRUCTED TO EVAC MATE ALL MIP HILITARY PERSONEL FROM THE OCCUPIED AREA AND COMPINE JAPANESE TROOPS TO THEIR BIVOUAGS. JAP CIVIL POLICE, WITH SMALL FILE MISS, ARE TO MEMAIN IN THE LANDING ZONES TO TAKE CARE OF POLICE, WITHOUT SMALL FILE MISSES ARE TO MEMAIN S. COASTAL GUNS ARE TO BE WITHOUT BREACH LOCKS AND ALL J.P. MESE WASHIPS ARE TO THROW THEIR EXPLOSIVES OVERBOARD AS WELL AS GIVE THE ALLIES THEIR LOCATION. AN ESCORT WILL LEAD THE ALLIED AREAD. INTO THE TOKYO BAY WHILE J.P. MESE WAYAL SHIPS ARE TO PILOT OUR GRAPT THROUGH MINE IMPESTED WATERS THAT HAVE NOT BEEN COMPLETELY CLEARED.

GEMERAL BLC LETTUR FLS ORDERED THE JAPS TO BE ON THE ALERT BEGINNING AT 6 A.M. SUNDAY MOINING FOR THE ALLIED ARRIVAL. ALECEATT OF THE JAPANESE EMPIRE, BOTH CIVILLAN AND MILITARY, LAST TO BE GROUNDED AT 1800 FRIDAY WITH FEW EXCEPTIONS, GRANTED BY GRASHAL HAS ARTHUR UPON THE JAP RECUEST, THAT ARE NECESSARY FOR PROPARATION OF THE JALIED LANDING.

SO PAR, THE JAPANESE HAVE CARRIED OUT IN FULL, INSTRUCTIONS RELAYED TO TORYO FROM THE MANILA CONFERENCE AND COOPERATION AT THE CONFERENCES IN MANILA INDICATED THE JAPANESE GOVERNMENT WOULD ALSO COOPERATE IN THE ALLIED LANDING. TOKYO NEWSPAPERS AND RADIOS CONTINUE TO URGE THE JAPANESE PEOPLE TO MAINTAIN CROBER AND HELP THE ALLIED PORCES THEN THEY OCCUPY THE HOLE IS-LANDS. TOKYO RADIO INTERPPETED THE POTSDAM ULTILATUM TO LEAN THE ALLIES WOULD BE LENIENT SINCE COCUPATIONAL FORCES IN GENERAL AND LAKING SLAVES OF THE CONQUESED PROPIE AND THAT THE MANIL. INSTRUCTIONS OFDER THE JAPANESE TO CS.SE FIGHTING TO LEAD A PEACEFUL LIFE AT HOLE. NEWSPAPERS APPEALED TO THE POPULICE BY SAYING "ACTIONS OF THE HIPPONESS WILL DETERMINE THEM THEAT LENT AT THE HANDS OF THE CONCHERORS."


AN UNOFFICIAL REPORT FROM WASHINGTON STATES THAT ADMINAL NIMITY WHIL SIGN THE JAPANESE SURRENIER DOCUMENT FOR THE UNITED STATES AND GENERAL MAC ARTHUR WILL SIGN FOR THE BIG FOUR. OTHER COUNTRIES TO SIGN THE DOCUMENT INCLUDE; BRITAIN, CHINA, AUSTRALIA, FRANCE, SOVIET RUSSIA, CANADA, THE PHILIPPINE COMMONWEALTH, HOLLAND AND NEW ZEALAND.

ALL JAPANESE FORCES ON THE ASLATIC MAINLAND HAVE LAID DOWN THEIR ARMS IN UNCONDITION I SURFENDER. PORGAL SURFENDER PLANS ARE BEING MADE IN CHIKLANG FOR THE CAPITUL TION OF TROOPS IN CHIMA AND DOCUMENTS WILL BE SIGNED IN CHUNKING AFTER THE TOKYO SIGNING. THE RUSSIANS HAVE MORE THAN 250,000 JAP PRISONERS IN THEIR STOCKARES INCLUDING 20 GENERALS. ON SAKHALIN ISLAND, HED ARRELES HAVE TAKEN SCHE 50,000 PRISONERS.
