Keeping Our Kids Healthy

Children in military families are exposed to stress levels that could be considered toxic according to The American Academy of Pediatrics. The National Center for Child Traumatic Stress notes that, "Military children experience unique challenges related to military life and culture. These include deployment-related stressors and reintegration." Managing stress and maintaining a healthy lifestyle as a family, needs to be a high priority in order to ensure a successful future for our military children.

Over the past three decades, childhood obesity rates in America have tripled, and today, nearly one in three chil-

dren in America are overweight or obese. If we don't solve this problem, one third of all children born in 2000 or later will suffer from diabetes at some point in their lives. Many others will face chronic obesity-related health problems like heart disease, high blood pressure, cancer, and asthma. Children become overweight for a variety of reasons. The most common causes are lack of physical activity and unhealthy eating patterns. Only in rare cases is being overweight caused by a medical condition such as a hormonal or genetic problem. Today, children experience a very different lifestyle. Walks to and from school have been replaced by car and bus rides. Gym class and after-school sports have been cut; afternoons are now spent with TV, video games, and the internet. Parents are also busier than ever and families eat fewer home-cooked meals.

Of course, you want to make sure your children grow up fit and healthy. But you also know it's hard to juggle work, family, and physical activity. Still, setting a healthy example is a good start; research shows that parents who are physically active increase the likelihood that their kids will be active as well. Exercise

is a very effective stress relief activity for kids and promotes a healthy, balanced lifestyle. Set aside one day a weekend to do something active as a family, like: swimming, biking or hiking. Take along a nutritious picnic lunch and make it fun! Try setting a time limit on weekly television and video games to facilitate outdoor activity. However, if you vegetate in front of the TV every night, the remote control in one hand and a bag of chips in the other, you're not practicing what you preach. And your kids aren't likely to respect restrictions you set on their screen time either. So check your own viewing behavior and serve as a role model by incorporating physical activity into your everyday life. Take the dog for walks together, and squeeze in some running, roller-skating, or jump rope while you're at it. Set aside a family "work time," with every member of the family doing active housecleaning, window-washing and vacuuming. This, too, is exercise!

Families that eat healthier also tend to have other healthy habits, such as regular physical activity. Take kids to the farmers' market, let them pick their own fruits and vegetables, and involve them in the food preparation. They're much more likely to enjoy their meals—and to clean their plates. USDA's new food icon, MyPlate, serves as a quick visual reminder to all consumers to make healthy food choices when you choose your next meal, built off of the 2010 Dietary Guidelines for all Americans. MyPlate can help prioritize food choices by reminding us to make half of our plate fruits and vegetables and shows us the other important food groups for a well-balanced meal: whole grains, lean proteins, and low fat dairy.







Noguni Sokan: Great Man Who Saved The People From Famine



Noguni Sokan's statue stands at the entrance to Kadena Michino-eki. He has a sweet Noguni potato in the left hand.

A bronze statue of a man stands at the entrance to Kadena Michinoeki, a road station center, which is used by many visitors and foreigners to view Kadena Air Base. The statue is of Noguni Sokan, who is said to have saved the Ryukyus.

Noguni Sokan - his real name has been lost over the ages - was born in the Noguni village of Kadena Township. The village has perished since Noguni Sokan's time, but it would have been located on what is now Kadena Air Base.

During the period of the Ryukyu Kingdom, Noguni Sokan served as sokan (Captain) of a tribute ship traveling from Ryukyu to China.

In 1605, he brought back sweet potato cuttings from the Fukien province of China and cultivated them in Noguni village. In those days, the Ryukytu people often suffered from famine, and many died from starvation. When Noguni Sokan distributed the cultivated sweet potatoes to Nozato, Sunabe and other nearby villages, the food situation improved dramatically. This year is 405 anniversary of the introduction of sweet potato by Noguni Sokan.

Hearing about this, a man named Gima Shinjo obtained sweet potato cuttings from Noguni Sokan and spread them throughout Okinawa along with the knowledge of their cultivation. Within 15 years, the sweet potato spread throughout the entire island and became as important food source that saved the people from famine.

Later, the Satsuma clan in present day Kagoshima Prefecture, which came to control the sweet potato through the entire region of Japan. Called Satsuma potato, it saved the Japanese people from famine and war devastation.

Some people of Kadena Township voice the opinion that it should not be called Satsuma potato, but should instead be called Noguni or Sokan potato.

Noguni Sokan's native Kadena Township holds a Noguni Sokan festival every year around October. Other projects also exist to instill the remarkable Noguni Sokan spirit in the community. For example, there is a children's drum team named Sokan Taiko.

Located within Kadena Marina is the tomb of Noguni Sokan and a monument to explain where sweet potato cultivation began. It fixed this tomb as the Prefectural Culture Property on February 22, 1956.

Another monument that explains the remarkable accomplishment of Noguni Sokan in English and Japanese has been erected with the cooperation of the 18th Wing.

A Noguni Sokan Shrine has also been built within Kadena Township.

Noguni Sokan is remembered with fondness, and he remains respected by people even today.

Hina Matsuri (Girls' Day)

March 3 is celebrated in Japan as *Hina Matsuri*, literally translated as Doll Festival, but also known as Girl's Day.

A traditional collection of dolls, hina-ningyo, associated with Girl's Day is generally displayed for a limited time in a place of honor around March 3. It is be-




Dairi-sama (left) and Ohina-sama.

lieved that allowing the display to remain out for more than three days will cause the little girl they honor to marry at a late age. The collection of *hinaningyo* is highlighted by a *dairi-sama* and *ohina-sama*, which are placed at the top level of a display stand. The *dairi-sama* and *ohina-sama* represent the emperor and empress. On lower levels of the stand are female and male attendants, musicians, courtiers, and other members of the Imperial Household.

Hina-ningyo displays range in price from as little as \$100 to upwards of \$3,000.

Besides dolls, other items included with the display are hina-arare (rice crackers), ama-zake or siro-zake, and hishi-mochi (diamond-shaped rice cakes).

Hina-arare is a Japanese confection made with glutinous rice and sugar.



Hina-arare (left) and ama-zake are usually included with hina-ningyo displays.


Ama-zake is made from fermented rice and is not a liquor, while shiro-zake is made with sake-lees and includes alcohol. During early March, hina-arare and ama-zake are sold at supermarkets with prices generally ranging from 100 to 500 yen.




To the dismay and astonishment of most Japanese, it





½ c peanut butter ¼ c brown sugar

½ c peanut or vegetable oil

dash cayenne or liquid hot pepper 2 lbs chicken, cut into 1" cubes Combine all ingredients, except

chicken, in a blender. Blend until smooth. Reserve 1 cup of marinade and refrigerate. Marinate chicken in remaining mix for 1-2 hours (or overnight). Soak skewers in water for about 30 minutes (this will prevent them from burning). String chicken on skewers. Grill over hot coals until brown, about 3-4 minutes per side. Serve with remaining marinade. Serves 6-8.
